St. Joseph School did not have enough players to support a team solely from our school so we partnered with St. Joseph Parish. This is also true for our 8th grade boys' team.

We are trying something new this year. Rather than having a Student Council, we are having a student activity group. This is a little less formal and hopefully more activities will be generated through this group. We were fortunate to have two eighth grade boys come forward to lead this new activity group. Other upper grade students were very supportive of having Jack Gagnon serve as President and Jason Euceda, serve as vice president. Mr. Krause is the staff advisor. Mrs. Seleen has offered to supervise students who might be interested in being bell ringers at Bay Park Square for the Salvation Army. This activity will take place within the next few weeks. The students will all make 1 card in their class but if any of your families would consider making a card or several cards at home that would be terrific. Send any handmade cards to school on or before Friday, Dec. 9. This is a little early but the organization needs time to attach the cards to the gift bags and distribute the gift bags to over 15 area nursing homes in time for Christmas. You can make the card say to: a friend, from: first name only or if you're comfortable you can sign it with your family name Ex. From, The Hoard Family. The cards made at school will only have the child's first name. Whatever size or materials you decide to use will be fine. Thanks for helping with this worthwhile project in helping to make someone else's Christmas a happy time!
